

BIOGRAPHY

Alexandra Hsu is a director-producer, born and raised in Orange County, CA. She fell in love with film in high school, and attended the USC Summer Film Program to test her interest. Film was a perfect fit for Alexandra - a combination of her parents' careers - father was an engineer-entrepreneur, mother was an artist-fashion designer. Alexandra has directed short films in Asia, Europe, and USA. Her short film, "Sophie," shot in Hong Kong, screened at twenty film festivals worldwide, including Oscar-Qualifying Festivals such as Austin, Foyle, LA Asian Pacific, and HollyShorts. Alexandra is in post-production on two of her short films - "POP!" and "Rencontres Paysannes." Her most recent short film, "Our Way Home" had its World Premiere at Oscar-Qualifying HollyShorts. Alexandra was a resident in the SFFILM FilmHouse Residency, where SFFILM has supported the development of her first feature, Queens, inspired by a 1960s family story focused during the New York World's Fair, and a narrative limited series about the Vincent Chin story and movement. Alexandra was also highlighted on NBC News as the Kearny Street Workshop Featured Artist in Film at the 20th APAture Arts Festival (SF). She was selected to direct a short film for the CBS Leadership Pipeline Challenge. With her interest in US-China relations, she became a member of the China Institute Next Gen Leaders Circle last year. Alexandra received her BA from Scripps College, double majoring in Media Studies and Asian Studies. Her undergraduate thesis was a documentary film, "Women: Cultural Revolution to Capitalist Revolution" which received the Media Studies Award and the Pomona College Museum "China Insights" Exhibit Grant. Alexandra graduated from NYU Tisch School of the Arts with her MFA in Film Directing and Production.

DIRECTORS STATMENT

When I started working on this project, I was dating a Frenchman. I'd half-jokingly told him that I was going to make a short film in France since he had a car there—in my opinion, if you have a car, you can do anything. In the midst of writing the script with my classmate Chris Vennemeyer, however, the Frenchman and I broke up. The story morphed from a Frenchman in search of WiFi so that he can communicate with his girlfriend abroad to a heartbroken female farmer struggling to understand the new world of dating apps in rural France. In many ways, making this film was a journey through my own heartbreak. Ultimately, *Rencontres Paysannes - Farmers Dating* offers a lighthearted look at what it means to search for love in the digital era. It is a story about cultivating self-love and rekindling joy through the simple pleasures of life, friendship, and, of course, dating.

Marion SERVOLE is a French actress, born and raised in Paris. After following a French Classical Theatre training in Paris in a District Conservatory, she moved to New York and joined the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theatre and Film Institute.

She started her film career in NY, starring in Richard Ledes' *The Caller* (2008), alongside Frank Langella and Eliott Gould. The film premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival. Back in France, Marion starred in several projects including short films, commercials, and a French TV series, *Section de recherches*. She spoke both French and English in these projects.

Because Marion is bilingual, she often works with international teams. One of her latest international collaborations is with Chinese- American filmmaker Alle Hsu in short film, "Farmer's Dating (Rencontres Paysannes)" in which she plays the lead character, Victoire.

Marion has also written several short screenplays, some of which she has also directed, such as "An unlucky way to get lucky," "Blanche Neige," "Aux Poils!" and "Sam Samuel", which were Official Selections at different film festivals in France and Russia.

Born Sophie Barge, this actress finds her stage name «Romane Arki» in 2015, at the renowned Studio Pygmalion Paris, Montrouge Area, which was able to welcome important personalities such as Marion Cottillard, Anne Parillaud or Sophie Marceau.


She grew up in a difficult area and discovered the theatre at the age of 11. She pursued many workshops around the stage until she was 16. In 2002, she managed to enter the Superior Theater Class at the Lycée International des Pontonniers (20 profiles accepted out of 500). She works with actors from the Strasbourg's National Theater. At the age of 17, she wrote her first play «The appearance of the light is sometimes unexpected» recounting first loves. At the age of 21, she write her first screenplay, a 25-minute drama fiction, "La Vie de Rêve."

It describes a world where Emotion is a Business. It works at the service of TV audiences to the detriment of the human condition. She made this film on her own in 2012 with 34 volunteers. The film suffers from many mistakes but confirms the actress in the courage of her ambitions. She left her hometown and moved to Paris in 2013, accepted at Studio Pygmalion. She stayed there until 2015. Since then she has been shooting in a youtube series, several short-metrages and giving her voice to the dubbing studios.

William PRUNCK is a French actor living in Paris. He studied acting in two public schools in Paris where he was given a classical stanislavskian approach of acting and later, he entered during three years a Paris high school of dramatic art called ESAD (Dramatic Art Superior School) in which he could experiment various technics of acting (meyerholdian way of acting by using the body in peculiar, clown, masks in actor training, movie acting...). He also learnt how to dance and to sing. First he was an actor of theater: here are some pieces, Blasted of Sarah Kane, Das brennende Dorf of Fassbinder but several improvised comical sketchs based on clowny situations. On the other hand, he was interested in pictures too since he was a teenager: his first founder movie is A clockwork orange of Stanley Kubrick, but also movies of Charlie Chaplin and mainly Buster Keaton! That's why, he is interested in acting into features films like Open Tables of Jack C. Newell. You can see him in a lot of short movies, one of these The Teletraining of a french director Guillaume de Ginestel, goes round the world, from Mexico to Italy and Japan: in this short movie he plays a novice and necessarily hit man. He has won a small part in a big French movie directed by Mia Hansen-Løve. He also plays in TV movies like Je te promets, Paris etc of Zabou Breitman, Nina, L'art du crime, Scènes de ménage... Recently, he plays in La pièce rapportée de Antonin Peretjatko and Madame Claude of Sylvie Verheyde. Finally, he keeps on writing: his two short movies called Jack Line1 & 2 won prices.




